ORDER

The matter before the court is the parties' joint "Motion to Set Briefing Schedule and Page Limitations" ("Motion") (docket no. 81), which the parties filed on June 9, 2016. In the Motion, the parties request that the court modify the Amended Briefing Schedule (docket no. 64) to allow the Federal Housing Finance Agency ("FHFA") to submit a supplemental brief in support of its Motion to Dismiss (docket no. 76). The parties further request that the court modify the deadline set forth in the court's April 4, 2016 Order. *See* April 4, 2016 Order (stating that, "[i]n the event the Panel denies the motion to transfer, Plaintiffs must file their resistances to the pending Motions to Dismiss . . . in the instant action by no later than fourteen days after the Panel's decision" (formatting omitted)). For the reasons stated in the Motion, the court finds that the Motion should be granted.


Accordingly, the Motion is **GRANTED** as follows:

1. The FHFA's supplemental brief in support of its Motion to Dismiss shall be filed by **no later than June 16, 2016 and shall not exceed eight pages in length;**

2. Plaintiffs' resistance to Defendants' Motions to Dismiss (including any resistance to the FHFA's supplemental brief) shall be filed **by no later than June 30, 2016 and shall not exceed eighty-eight pages in length;**
3. Defendants' replies in support of their Motions to Dismiss (including any replies regarding the FHFA's supplemental brief) shall be filed **by no later than August 1, 2016 and shall not exceed twenty-five pages in length.**

IT IS SO ORDERED.
